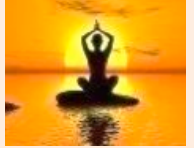

For the Poncho Top: Lion Brand LB Collection Cotton Bamboo (Weight: 3/light – 245 yds, 3.5 oz) Magnolia (#487-098) – 5 (5, 6, 6, 6, 7) skeins [(approx. 400 (440, 480, 520, 560, 600) g], Tapestry needle, Size G (4.0 mm) crochet hook, Stitch markers or safety pins.

350+ YEAR EVOLUTION OF SALSA

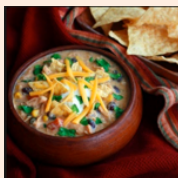
SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 15 AT 2:00PM

FILM SERIES

SEPTEMBER 13 AND 14 - *Murder on the Orient Express* (2017). What starts out as a lavish train ride through Europe quickly unfolds into one of the most stylish, suspenseful and thrilling mysteries ever told. From the novel by best-selling author Agatha Christie, tells the tale of thirteen strangers stranded on a train, where everyone is a suspect. One man must race against time to solve the puzzle before the murderer strikes again.

SEPTEMBER 27 AND 28 - *The Post*. Determined to uphold the nation's civil liberties, Katharine Graham, publisher of the Washington Post, and hard-nosed editor Ben Bradlee join forces to expose a decades-long cover-up. However, the two must risk their careers and their freedom to bring truth to light.

OCTOBER 11 AND 12 - *The Mountain Between Us*. Stranded after a tragic plane crash, two strangers must forge a connection to survive the extreme elements of a remote snow-covered mountain. When they realize help is not coming, they embark on a perilous journey across the wilderness.

OCTOBER 25 AND 26 - *Battle of the Sexes*. In the wake of the sexual revolution and the rise of the women's movement, the 1973 tennis match between women's world champion Billie Jean King and ex-men's-champ and serial hustler Bobby Riggs became one of the most watched televised sports events of all time, reaching 90 million viewers around the world. As the rivalry between King and Riggs kicked into high gear, off-court each was fighting more personal and complex battles.

NOVEMBER 8 AND 9 - *Hidden Figures*. As the United States raced against Russia to put a man in space, NASA found untapped talent in a group of African-American female mathematicians that served as the brains behind one of the greatest operations in U.S. history. Dorothy Vaughan, Mary Jackson, and Katherine Johnson crossed all gender, race, and professional lines while their brilliance and desire to dream big, beyond anything ever accomplished before by the human race, firmly cemented them in U.S. history as true American heroes.

NOVEMBER 29 AND 30 - *The Greatest Showman*. A musical biography of "the greatest showman" PT Barnum. The film celebrates the birth of show business, and tells of a visionary who rose from nothing to create a spectacle that became a worldwide sensation.
